Yungaburra State School will receive

\$67,658

This funding will be used to

- Implement our Positive Education Framework with a focus on Student and Staff Learning and Wellbeing.
- Improve school community engagement.
- Enhance differentiation including intervention for students at risk as well as providing opportunities for enrichment and extension.
- Improvement Measure 1: Increase in student positive behaviours recognised by staff and recorded on One School. Positives in 2018 = 218 2019 Target = 300. Major Behaviour Incidents 2018 = 56. Decrease in major behaviour incidents by 50% in 2019.
- Improvement Measure 2: Improvement in School Opinion Data in relation to Behaviour Management (Short Term) SOS 2018 Parents = 70.4 Staff = 74.4 Students = 68.8 2019 Targets = 90%.
- Improvement in student achievement (A – E data), attendance rates and behaviour (Medium to Long Term).

Our initiatives include

- Revised Responsible Behaviour Plan 2019 – 2022.
- Implementation of the Australian Health Curriculum Subject.
- Development of the Yungaburra State School's Positive Education Framework.
- Explicit Teaching of our school community's values: Kindness, Respect and Learning.
- Review and enhancement of student engagement strategies.
- Review and enhancement of parent engagement strategies.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

- Providing class release time for our Highly Accomplished Teacher (HAT) to lead a team (including team member release) in the development of our Positive Education Framework and to provide professional learning to school staff. (10 days = \$4500 HAT and \$3500 for team members)
- Continuing to provide class teachers with additional release time for collaborative curriculum planning with Head of Curriculum. (\$10 000)
- Continuing to purchase additional teacher aide time to specifically work with Support Teacher Learning and Needs (STLN) to provide early years literacy and numeracy intervention. (\$28 000)
- Purchasing of visual signage to support explicit teaching of our school values. (\$5 000)
- Provision of professional learning opportunities as per our explicit improvement agenda. (\$10 000)
- Continued renewal of literacy resources as identified. (\$2658)
- Community Engagement Strategies (\$1000)
- Resource Management and Administration for School Improvement Initiatives. (\$3 000)
